





Our topic for this half term is...

Paws, Claws and Whiskers.

We are going to start our new topic 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers' by reading "I Want A Pet", a humorous story which features some rather unusual pet options. We will consider what makes a good pet and why some are definitely the wrong choice. We will also be reading other stories by Lauren Child, including "I Absolutely Love Animals", "That Pesky Rat" and some Charlie and Lola stories. If you have any books by the same author at home, please share them with your child, and if possible please send them into school so that your child can share them with their friends.



During British Science Week, (13th – 17th March) we will be inviting your pets to visit us in school. Through firsthand experience with pets in the classroom and a visit to a vets' practice we will identify, name, describe and compare the structure of a variety of pets. More details to follow.





We have a very exiting art project coming up culminating in an exhibition. Year 1 will be working with clay and the textures that can be made with a variety of tools. We look forward to showing, and hopefully selling you our work at the whole school exhibition!



In Maths, we will apply our number knowledge to problem solving, and explaining our strategies using mathematical vocabulary. We will collect information about our favourite pets on tally charts and then present the data on graphs. We will continue to count in 2's, 5's and 10's and begin to look at multiplication, division and fractions.

In R.E, as we approach Easter, we will talk about the Easter story and The Last Supper. We will be thinking about special meals, what they are, who we share them with and why they are special to us. We will consider how we celebrate Easter what it means to Christians around the world.



How Can You Help.

As always it would be greatly appreciated if you could continue to practise and use Letters and Sounds to support reading and writing, and to practice correct letter formation at home. It really does help develop confidence and enables progress in your child's learning.

Please continue to help your child learn the **100 high frequency words**. When they can read the words fluently, please encourage them to spell the words so that they can use them in their writing correctly.

Any work that you could do with your child at home counting in 2's, 5's and 10's – splitting objects into groups, sharing things between sets – would be very helpful.

The children retold the stories using the puppets in the theatre and practised including story language.

Each child chose the material that they wanted to use and had a go at making their own house.
